The product does not contain organically bounded halogens (AOX-free).

The surfactant(s) contained in this preparation complies(comply) with the biodegradability criteria as laid down in Regulation (EC) No.648/2004 on detergents. Data to support this assertion are held at the disposal of the competent authorities of the Member States and will be made available to them, at their direct request or at the request of a detergent manufacturer.

The contained organic complexing agents reach a DOC-elimination grade of 80% (corresponding to No. 406 of Annex "Analytic and measuring methods") and with this meet the tightened demands of Annex 49 of the revised Directive on liquid waste.
